### <u>Astro Dome</u>

Science Week began by a mobile planetarium coming to Carrington Junior School. All year groups had a 50 minute presentation inside the Astro Dome. This was an inspiring presentation about the Earth, Sun and Moon, the other planets in our Solar system and images of the night sky including black holes. Peter Golding also talked about space travel. He showed the film footage of Neil Armstrong and fellow astronauts landing on the moon and suggested that one of our school children could be travelling to Mars in the future. Astro Dome have a super website with great links to other science sites with countless ideas of activities to do at home. So please encourage your children to have a go in Easter holidays. ### Children taking the lead in Science Investigations

This year Carrington Junior School is taking part in the Big Science Event, a science competition organised by Science Oxford. Our winning team will go forward to a cluster judging round in May and if we are lucky enough to win, to a finals day in June in Buckinghamshire.

Children have chosen to investigate a variety of questions, e.g. Which fizzy drink produces the highest fountain? Which sweets melt the quickest? Which metal oxidises (rusts) the quickest? Does slime help you concentrate? Which ingredients make the most foam? How can you make oobleck dance?

The children have really enjoyed taking responsibility for their learning; planning their experiments, carrying them out, recording results and drawing conclusions from their own investigations. Year 6 have been concentrating on SATs preparation so later in the Summer Term they will have their own Science Week.
