All children also have a Sumdog account username and password. This account allows the children to join in with competitions as well as improve their math's skills on fun games. With RMEasimaths everyone in the school has a log in. Each child will be on a level on the site and it brings up all activities for that level. If your child struggles with one section, it will continue to bring similar problems in that area up for your child. They are 15 minute sessions and the session times out after 15 minutes, but they are able to go back into it to complete ...another section.
