Rationale

We believe that it is important for every child to attend school in full uniform, with clean face and hands. A clean, smart appearance and the wearing of uniform have a number of advantages:

1. Our children are easily identified for security reasons;
2. Children associate their uniforms with settled behaviour and work;
3. All children look and are treated as equals;
4. Uniform limits the influence of fashion and status;
5. Wearing uniform helps children to take pride in their school;
6. Other clothes are kept good for life outside school.

We greatly appreciate the support of parents/carers with uniform.

We believe that what a child wears to school reflects his/her learning. We want our children to be proud of their school and we feel that by wearing the school's smart but simple uniform, our children portray the school's ethos and shared positive values.



Uniform:

- Grey school trousers/ grey, knee-length skirt or pinafore dress
- School blue polo shirt/ white shirt or blouse
- Carrington school tie
- Royal blue school sweatshirt/school cardigan
- Summer Uniform: blue and white dress / summer blouse and skirt
- Plain grey or white socks
- Carrington polar fleece (optional)

All pupils should wear sensible, flat black. Trainers are not allowed except for PE.

For PE:

- Royal blue school shorts
- Royal blue school T-Shirt
- Plimsolls for indoor PE
- Sensible trainers for outdoor PE
- A plain, dark jogging suit and long royal blue socks for outdoor games.
- A PE bag is required for the kit
- Year 4 – swimming trunks / one-piece swimming costume, hat and towel for summer term only.

For health and safety reasons jewellery, including earrings and studs, is not permitted. Watches may be worn. Parents are advised that, if they wish to have their child's ears pierced, it is more appropriate that it be done at the beginning of the long summer holidays. Hair should be cut and styled in a conventional manner without artificial colouring. Long hair (beyond the collar) should be tied back unobtrusively. Plain royal or dark blue hair bands may be worn. Coloured hair braids and beads are not acceptable. The rules apply to both boys and girls.
