I am delighted to announce that Ms Gibbons will be our new SENDCo and ARP leader. Ms Gibbons will also undertake the role of Assistant Head in the school. Ms Gibbons has a wealth of experience with SEN as she has already been a SENDCo at a previous school. In order to prepare Ms Gibbons for the role, she has been working closely with Mrs Gonzalez over the past few weeks.
