Dear Parents and Carers.

Welcome back! We hope you had a brilliant summer and are now fully rejuvenated and ready for the year ahead – the final (and hopefully the best) one at Carrington Juniors. This newsletter will highlight the various topics that we will be covering this term. On the reverse, you will find other important information and significant dates for your calendar. During this term, your child will be reading several texts, enabling them to investigate a variety of authors' writing styles, as well as writing their own creative pieces. We will be reading a range of literature, including:



- There's a Boy in the Girls' Bathroom • (Louis Sacher)
- Street Child (Bernie Doherty)
- The Dancing Bear (Michael Morpurgo)

Please remember that your child must read every night for at least 15 minutes. To make the most of this time, time should also be spent discussing the text they have read. Please record your child's reading within their Reading Record as this is checked frequently.



This term, we will cover the fundamentals of the subject - place value, a focus of the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) and learning the times tables at increasing speed.

It is imperative that children rehearse their skills regularly to ensure secure а understanding of all four operations in a range of real-life situations to support problem-solving. Any activities (such as shopping, measuring, budgeting etc) that you can do with your child will benefit them immensely.

Every child will have the opportunity to use RM Maths and My Maths at home homework may form part of this usage.

Our opening topic for this academic year will undertake a scrutiny of how the Mayans lived. This topic offers a fascinating insight into how an ancient civilisation was organised and how much they valued learning.

In science lessons, we will be examining evolution. In RE, we will be learning about the two of the world's largest religious followings: Islam and Christianity. In our computing learning, we will be focusing on the all-important notion of e-safety.

**Spellings** – words will be given out and need to be learned in preparation for a weekly spelling test.

Maths - Relevant to weekly learning.

**English/ Topic/ Other** – To build independence and time management skills, with half an eye on secondary school, we have decided to use a cross- curricular homework grid – watch this space!

**SATs revision** – Periodically, homework will be set from CGP books, for both maths and grammar.
