Rationale

We believe that it is important for every child to attend school in full uniform, with clean face and hands. A clean, smart appearance and the wearing of uniform have a number of advantages:

- 1. Our children are easily identified for security reasons;
- 2. Children associate their uniforms with settled behaviour and work;
- 3. All children look and are treated as equals;
- 4. Uniform limits the influence of fashion and status;
- 5. Wearing uniform helps children to take pride in their school;
- 6. Other clothes are kept good for life outside school.

We greatly appreciate the support of parents/carers with uniform.

We believe that what a child wears to school reflects his/her learning. We want our children to be proud of their school and we feel that by wearing the school's smart but simple uniform, our children portray the school's ethos and shared positive values.

Girls

- School Tie
- White Shirt (not open neck blouse)
- Grey Skirt or Pinafore (approximately knee length)
- Grey Trousers
- Grey or White Socks (knee or ankle length only)
- Navy or Grey Tights
- Royal Blue Cardigan/Unisex Jumper/Sweatshirt
- Black or Navy Shoes (up to 5cm heel only)

No boots, wedges or strapless sandals.

In the summer term, after the Easter holidays, the girls may wear a blue and white checked or striped dress, or a white polo shirt with our school logo and a grey skirt, pinafore or trousers with grey or white socks. The children should wear a sun hat and/or sun screen when appropriate. School caps can be purchased from M&S online.

Boys

- School Tie
- White Shirt
- Long Grey Trousers
- Royal Blue Unisex Jumper/Sweatshirt
- White or Grey Socks
- Black or Navy Shoes

In the summer term, after the Easter holidays, boys may wear a white polo shirt with our school logo and grey long/short trousers with grey or white socks. The children should wear a sun hat and/or sun screen when appropriate. School caps can be purchased from M&S online.

PE Kit

- Royal blue t-shirt (with school logo)
- Royal blue shorts (No Bermuda style or lycra shorts please)
- Plain dark jogging bottoms and sweatshirt may be worn over PE kit in winter
- Plimsolls for indoor games
- Trainers for outdoor games

The above items must be kept in a drawstring sports bag which can be purchased from M&S online.

Please mark all items of clothing with the child's name because school cannot accept responsibility for lost jumpers, trainers, etc.

Hair

Long hair should be tied back using plain blue, white or red hair bands, slides or ribbons. Please avoid extreme hairstyles.

Footwear / Jewellery

- Trainers will be needed for games, but may not be worn indoors.
- Pupils are not allowed to wear jewellery in school.
- Earrings are not permitted in school.
- No nail varnish or make-up is permitted.
- Digital and analogue watches are permitted but should be removed for PE.
- Children may wear simple step trackers but these should not be capable of receiving or sending messages or pictures. Expensive items are worn at parents' own risk.
