1	Create an <b>annotated diagram</b> showing the workings of an Anderson or Morrison shelter.	Make your own Christmas craft or <b>decoration</b> . This could be a hanging tree decoration, a wreath, a lantern, a snow globe... the possibilities are endless. Get creative!	Create an <b>information leaflet</b> on changes in materials. You could define irreversible and reversible changes. It could also include methods of separating mixtures (e.g. dissolving, evaporating, etc.). Make sure that you include pictures and diagrams, as well as information	Plan and <b>cook / bake</b> something traditional for Christmas. For instance, Christmas biscuits, stollen, cupcakes, etc. You need to include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Ingredients / Equipment</li> <li>• Instructions</li> <li>• Reviews</li> </ul>
2	<b>Create</b> a basic French phrase book for a first-time visitor to Paris.	Make a <b>cartoon strip</b> summarising the story of The Dancing Bear.	In the role of Lady Macbeth, <b>persuade</b> Macbeth to either kill King Duncan or spare his life. This needs to be an extended piece of writing.	Create a <b>scenario or write a script for a drama piece</b> teaching others how to express their opinions and whilst being respectful to others.
3	Create a <b>worksheet</b> for <b>one</b> aspect of grammar or punctuation, e.g. a worksheet on apostrophes, passive/active voice, adverbial phrases or correct tenses, etc.	Research and make a <b>report</b> about one of the planes used in WW2.	Create a <b>venn diagram</b> defining different materials. You need a minimum of 20 materials to categorise.	Write your own <b>story</b> that has a <b>dilemma</b> that needs to be resolved.

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4	Compile a <b>fact file</b> about Adolf Hitler or Winston Churchill.	Write <b>for and against</b> whether Macbeth should kill King Duncan.	Write your own <b>Christmas song</b> or carol.	<b>Make</b> your own Anderson shelter model using a variety of materials.
5	<b>Create</b> a traditional French meal for your family. Capture photographic evidence.	<b>Research and explain</b> what algorithms are in computing. This can be displayed as a poster or as an extended piece of writing.	Write a letter as Macbeth to his wife, <b>reporting</b> about the victory of the opening battle and the prediction of the witches.	Create your own <b>mathematical puzzle</b> on <b>scratch</b> . You need to include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Instructions</li> <li>• Print screens of the game</li> <li>• Review of someone who has tried to solve the puzzle</li> </ul>
6	<b>Design</b> your own rations book.	Write a <b>character description</b> about one of the main characters in Clockwork (a book we will be reading in class).	Create a <b>storyboard</b> for a television commercial, advertising a new product out for Christmas. You will need to invent or design this product and explain what it is before creating the storyboard.	Design your own science experiment to <b>separate materials</b> . Remember to include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Instructions</li> <li>• Hypothesis</li> <li>• Equipment</li> <li>• Variables</li> <li>• How to ensure it is a fair test.</li> </ul>
7	Draw an <b>annotated diagram</b> of the five pillars of Islam. You need to <b>explain</b> its different <b>properties</b> and its significance in Islam.	Create a <b>set of rules</b> on how to give your opinion, whilst respecting other people's opinions.	Write a <b>poem</b> about one or more of the following themes: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Maintaining a positive attitude</li> <li>• Self-esteem and self-worth</li> <li>• Responsibility</li> </ul>	Using your <b>sewing skills</b> , create something out of material for Christmas. For instance, this could be a stocking, a Christmas tree, etc.
8	Using your <b>sketching</b> skills, produce a picture of the night sky during the Blitz .	<b>Research</b> one of the following Islamic significant periods and create <b>a fact file or information leaflet</b> : <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Eid Al-Fitr</li> <li>• Eid Al-Adha</li> <li>• Ramadan</li> </ul>	Write a <b>newspaper article</b> based on one of the key events of WW2, demonstrating all the relevant features: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Battle of Britain</li> <li>• The Blitz</li> <li>• Attack on Pearl Harbour</li> </ul>	Design and make your own <b>gingerbread house</b> . You need to include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Steps on how you made the gingerbread house</li> <li>• An evaluation</li> </ul>
