1	To create a mind map of 'There's a Boy in the Girls' Bathroom'.	Read and review another story written by Louis Sachar.	Create a fact file of Mayan civilisation.	Research the destruction of a rainforest. Answer the following questions: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • What is a rainforest? • Where in the world can you find rainforests? • Why are rainforests important? • What is causing the destruction of rainforests? • What impact is this having on local people? • What impact is this destruction having on the environment? • What impact is this destruction having on the animals? What can be done to limit the destruction of rainforests?
2	Create a map of modern-day Central America and one of the Mayan Empire.	Create a World War 1 or 2 propaganda poster.	Write a poem about how an animal would feel being in a zoo.	Create a model of an Mayan God or Goddess.
3	Research and then describe the habitat of a bear.	Argue for and against whether animals should be kept in captivity. This could be presented in a table format or as an extended piece of writing.	Visit a zoo and take pictures and review the animal conditions.	Make a piece of Mayan jewellery.

Veruca Salt, Augustus Gloop, Mike Teavee or Violet Beauregarde.	Create a game on Scratch. You need to include: Instructions Print screens of the game Review of someone who has played the game.
5	Create a Mayan-themed puzzle for someone to solve.	Collect a minimum of five different materials and state their properties. Compare and contrast their similarities and differences.	Research and create a report on Christianity.	Make and decorate Pandora's box, giving your interpretation of what you'd find inside.
6	Create a story board of the narrative of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory .	Create a poem on how to be respectful to others .	Learn and perform a song from Charlie and the Chocolate Factory – make sure you record the performance by either taking pictures or make a recording on a USB.
