Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back! We hope you have had a brilliant summer and are now fully rejuvenated and ready for the year ahead. This newsletter will detail the various topics that we will be covering this term. English

This term we will be delivering our English lessons based around different texts linked to our topic.

The main texts will be:

King Arthur and the Knights of the Round Table

Beowulf

We will also be undertaking work based around our planned trip to Ufton Court. The children will take part in a variety of speaking and listening activities as well as participating in drama and role play. Grammar, punctuation and spelling will be taught both through the texts and in separate skills lessons.

Reading is incredibly important at Carrington Junior School and will be a focus across all areas of the curriculum. All the children will have a reading book from the Big Cat Reading Scheme which they will be expected to read at home for at least ten minutes five times a week. We are happy for you to supplement your reading with other exciting texts so please come and visit our amazing new library.

Maths

This term, we will cover the fundamentals of the subject – place value, a focus of the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division) and learning times tables at an increasing speed.

It is imperative that children rehearse their skills regularly to ensure a secure understanding of all four operations in a range of real-life situations to support problemsolving. Any activities such as shopping, measuring, budgeting that you can do with your child will benefit them enormously.

<u>Seesaw</u>

We are very excited to work with you this year and will use **Seesaw** to ensure that we develop an effective home — school partnership. By the end of the very first week, you should have received your login details — all you require is your phone, tablet or PC. Your child will benefit massively from your decision to sign up to this free app.

Science & Topic

Our first science topic for this term will be Animals Including Humans where we will be looking at human development from birth to old age. Following this, we will be Materials and will include investigating properties of solids, liquids and gases and reversible and irreversible changes.

This term our topic is called **Behaviour from Scandinavia** and will be cross-curricular sessions including History, Geography, DT and Art. Throughout Year 5, the children will be taught how to play brass instruments by a music specialist but composition links will be made to each of the topics. As part of this topic, we will be learning about the daily lives of Anglo-Saxons and Vikings. We will also be re-enacting the Anglo-Saxon and Viking struggle for England. Let Battle Commence!



For the convenience of everyone, the weekly homework will be posted on **Seesaw**

Reading – this should be recorded at least five times a week and records will be checked weekly.

Spellings – words will be posted and need to be learned in preparation for a weekly spelling test.

Maths - A short task relevant to weekly learning using Mathletics.

English/ Topic/ Science – A short task related to weekly learning.
