



Year 3 Spring Curriculum Newsletter 2019

Welcome back! We all hope you had a great Christmas and New Year.

This term has been split into 2 themes. The first is 'We are Recyclers'. We will be particularly studying how we can be sustainable and the issues and consequences of pollution. Our second theme is 'We are Movers and Shakers' and we will be looking at volcanoes and earth quakes as well as famous people that have moved or shaken history.

We hope you find our newsletter useful; it will give you some information about what the children will be learning, dates for your diary and some ways to help with your child's learning.

English

For the first half term we will be looking at 'The Tin Forest' by Helen Ward. This book looks at ways that we can recycle and the positive effect this can have on our surroundings. We will be writing descriptions, diary entries and letters as well as using role-play, hot seating and freeze-framing.

After half-term we will be looking more at different forms of writing and studying people that have had an impact on the world.

Maths



We will be looking at place value, the four number operations (+ - x and ÷), shape, volume and capacity, time, fractions, perimeter, money and statistics. Regular practise of times tables and looking at digital and analogue clocks at home really helps with the children's learning and we appreciate your help with this. Mental arithmetic and time tables will be tested regularly.

Foundation Subjects

Our first topic this term is about being sustainable. We will be focusing on the effects of pollution, what we can do to make a difference and will be doing a study on the school's wind turbine. When we have a good understanding, we are going to be designing and making our own sustainable model of an island!

Our second topic is studying volcanoes and earthquakes. We will be looking at the types of rocks, why volcanoes erupt and will have a go at making our own model of an erupting volcano!

PE and Music

Our indoor PE lessons will be on Friday mornings for both classes and our outdoor lessons will be on Thursday afternoons with Mr Yearwood.

Our music lessons we will continue to be on Thursday afternoons and we will be continuing to learn how to play the recorder.
