### MATHS

We enjoyed wonderful success last term in maths — the children are benefitting greatly from the new Power Maths scheme. Many of the children have learnt their times tables, which has now meant they have been allowed to make excellent progress in a number of areas. Remember, the government expectation is for children to know ALL their times tables by the end of YEAR FOUR!

For those that still require additional support with their times tables, we shall be continuing our times tables grids against the clock. Please continue to practise these at home.

This term we will be looking to perfect exam technique. Generally, in a test situation, children still need to improve their time management and have the understanding of what the question is actually asking — we will continue to work on this.

Please remember, in addition to any maths homework given out, that Mathletics remains a useful tool to consolidate your child's learning.

# SCIENCE & Topic

The children learnt so much about the heart and other organs during the autumn term. This term, we will be exploring the themes of light and electricity. Keep tabs on Seesaw to be kept abreast of the children's latest scientific learning. For topic, we shall be delving into both the history of the local area and World War 2. Many children have showed a passion for WW2 as part of their homework grid, producing some sublime pieces.

#### Homework

Reading – this should be recorded daily.

**Spellings** — words will be given out and need to be learned in preparation for a weekly spelling test.

Maths - Relevant to weekly learning.

English/ Topic/ Other — To build independence and time-management skills, with half an eye on secondary school, we have decided to continue using the cross-curricular homework grid.

**SATs revision** — Periodically, homework will be set from CGP books, for maths, comprehension and grammar.

#### STATIONERY
