Curriculum update- Writing

At our inset day on Friday 28th May, staff will be receiving training in using a writing resource called Opening Doors, produced by Robert Cox. This resource looks at writing in a different way, by exposing children to extracts from classic texts. While the texts themselves may be more suitable to older children, the extracts are carefully selected to be challenging in a supported way, to give the children exposure to a wide range of vocabulary and writing styles. All children across the school completed a trial writing unit using this approach just before Easter and created some brilliant pieces. Why not ask your child about their 'Secret Garden' or 'Woman in White' piece of writing?

Covid symptoms developing during the half-term holiday

If any pupils develop symptoms of coronavirus on Friday, 28th May or Saturday, 29th May, you should contact the school office by email. Your child will need to isolate with your household until you have the results of a Covid-19 test for them. In this instance, please keep the school informed as soon as you can. If your child has a positive test result in the half-term holiday and was in school for the two days prior to their symptoms starting, you should notify the school by email since some other children may need to be told to isolate.

It is essential that families in these circumstances keep in touch with the school since other members of the school community may need to be informed about necessary isolation if a child in their class has a positive test during this window. You could potentially be contacted by school up to and including Wednesday, 2nd June about your child needing to isolate.

If your child develops symptoms of Covid-19 from Sunday, 30th May, you need to contact 111 for advice.
